

FORD CITY BOROUGH ORDINANCE NO. 1

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ORDINANCES

of

The Borough of Ford City, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania.

For the Government of the Borough of Ford City, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania

At a regular meeting of the members of the town council of the Borough of Ford City, Armstrong Co., Pa., held on the 16th day of December 1898, the following ordinances were adopted, ordained and enacted for the government of said borough:-

Be it ordained and enacted by the Chief Burgess and Council of the Borough of Ford City, in the County of Armstrong and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

ARTICLE #1.

Duties of Chief Burgess.

Section #1. The Chief Burgess shall grant licenses in accordance with the ordinances of the Borough, do all acts, and exercise all powers conferred by the Acts of Assembly of the Commonwealth upon his office, and in conjunction with the Council, shall control the High Constable and police force of the borough; he shall also have power, in case of emergency, to appoint special policeman, but such appointments shall not continue longer than two days at any one time, unless the same shall be approved by Council. It shall be the duty of the Burgess to preserve order and maintain the peace of the borough, to enforce the ordinances and regulations thereof, to hear complaints, to remove nuisances, and to exact a faithful performance of the duties of officers appointed for the maintenance of the peace; to impose fines and penalties, to keep a docket and make record therein of all cases that may be heard and decided by him, and to deliver the same docket to his successor.

Section #2. In the absence or inability of the Chief Burgess to perform his duties, any member of the Council designated by a majority thereof shall act as Chief Burgess.

Section #3. It shall be the duty of the Chief Burgess and officers acting under the authority of the borough, who may receive any funds of the borough from any source whatever, to pay to the Borough Treasurer, on or before the 10th day of each month, the full amount received or collected by them respectively during the preceding month, which said amounts shall be considered a part of the borough funds. Such payment shall be accompanied by a statement of the source from which said funds were received. The salary of the Burgess is hereby fixed at the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per annum, payable quarterly, in lieu of all fees, etc.

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## ARTICLE #2.

### PRESIDENT.

The President of the Town Council shall preside at all meetings of Council when present, and in case of his absence any member may preside. He shall sign all orders drawn on the Treasurer, and approved by the Council.

## ARTICLE #3.

### Duties of Secretary.

Section #1. The Borough Treasurer shall draw orders on the Treasurer for the amount of bills against the Borough which have passed the Council, keeping a register of the same; shall carefully file for preservation all returns, papers, vouchers and other documents belonging to the Borough; shall have charge of the seal of the borough and shall affix the same to all documents required to be thus authenticated; shall make out the borough duplicate for the use of the Borough Collector; shall keep accurate accounts of the outstanding liabilities of the borough, and shall annually, in conjunction with the Treasurer, immediately after the Auditors' settlement, make and submit to Council a report of the financial condition of the borough for the preceding fiscal year.

Section #2. He shall record all ordinances which have been passed by the Council in the proper book, and keep correct minutes of the proceedings of Council; give notice to members of Council of all meetings called by the President. And it shall further be his duty when a resolution requiring executive action is passed, to give written notice of the same to the Chief Burgess or other officers whose duties it may be to carry it into effect; and also to present without unnecessary delay after their passage, to the Chief Burgess for his approval, all ordinances which have passed the Council, making a record of the day and date on which they were presented, and he shall record same when approved by him, or passed by Council without his approval, according to law, in a book kept for that purpose. The salary of the Secretary is hereby fixed at the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per annum.

## ARTICLE #4.

### Duties of Treasurer.

Section #1. The Treasurer shall, within ten days after the time he is elected, give bond with at least two sufficient sureties to be approved by the Council, in such amount as Council may determine, and the bond shall be filed with the Borough Secretary.

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Section #2. He shall receive all moneys accruing to the borough and shall pay the same only upon orders drawn by the President and countersigned by the Secretary, and for the redemption of bonds and certificates of indebtedness of the borough when the same are due and payable, and shall deliver to his successor in office any books, money or property belonging to the borough, in his possession or control, upon the expiration of his term or upon his resignation or removal for any cause.

Section #3. He shall cause the accounts of his office to be kept in an intelligible manner wherein the receipts and expenditures shall be exhibited and the particulars of each item of charge and discharge shall correctly appear, and said accounts shall at all times during office hours, be open to the inspection of the Chief Burgess or any member of Council.

Section #4. He shall, when required to do so by the Borough Auditors, produce his books, papers, accounts and vouchers, and aid the said auditors in making a statement of the borough accounts; he shall also assist the Borough Secretary in making out his annual report of the financial condition of the borough.

Section #5. It shall be his duty to report to Council the first of each month, the amount of money on hand. On the first Monday of March of each and every year he shall make out and submit to Council an annual statement, closing the day preceding the first Monday in March, giving a clear and detailed statement of all moneys/received by him during the year, stating from whom and what source received, the amount paid out by him, classifying the kind or character of order or other evidence of indebtedness paid by him; also the amount of funds in the treasury.

### A R T I C L E NO. 5.

An ordinance for the Preservation of the Public Peace.

Section #1. Any person who shall engage within the limits of the borough in fighting, quarreling boisterously, disturbing or causing a disturbance of the public peace, or inciting others to fight and quarrel, and every person making an assault or an assault and battery on the person of another, and any person or persons who shall at any time make a loud, unusual or other improper noise, riot or disturbance or diversion on the streets, or shall call after another person in such a manner as to cause a breach of the peace, shall be guilty of disorderly conduct, and upon conviction before the Burgess shall be sentenced to pay the costs of prosecution, and to forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00), and in default of payment thereof shall undergo an imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30)

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## ARTICLE #6

To prohibit loafing on the Streets and Sidewalks.

Section #1. All persons are hereby prohibited from loafing, loitering, or standing upon any of the streets, pavements, crossings street corners, bridges or highways in said borough, or around the entrances to churches, railroad stations or any place of public resorts or entertainment so as to interfere with or obstruct the free passage of citizens along any of the said thoroughfares, or into or out of said churches or other buildings or places, or upon the steps, porticos, railings or fence of any private property within the limits of the borough, without the consent of the owner, and any person so offending shall be deemed guilty of an offense, and on conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding five dollars (\$5.00) and costs, or undergoing an imprisonment not exceeding five days (5).

## ARTICLE #7.

Relating to Vagrancy and Profane or Obscene Language and open Lewdness.

Section #1. It shall be the duty of the High Constable and Police at all times to apprehend all suspected nightwalkers, malefactors, vagabonds, rogues, tramps and disorderly persons, who may be found within the borough, and bring the same to the Chief Burgess to be examined; and any such person upon conviction of disorderly conduct calculated to disturb the peace, or of being found gathered together in disorderly assemblages shall be fined not less than one dollar (\$1.00) or more than ten dollars (\$10.00) and costs, or undergo an imprisonment not exceeding five (5) days in the Lock-up or thirty (30) days to jail. Persons thus arrested who cannot give a satisfactory account of themselves may be held as suspicious characters, or confined or detained as the Chief Burgess may think proper, under the circumstances.

## ARTICLE #8.

Drunkennes.

Section #1. Any person found within the borough in a state of intoxication or drunkenness, shall be guilty of an offense, and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding five dollars (\$5.00) or undergo imprisonment in the borough Lock-up not exceeding five (5) days.

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ARTICLE #9.

Throwing missiles upon streets.

Section #1. Any person throwing, or causing to be thrown on any of the streets or alleys of the said borough, shot, bullets, pebbles, stones or other missiles, shall be deemed guilty of an offense, and on conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding five dollars (\$5.00) and costs, or undergo an imprisonment not exceeding five (5) days.

ARTICLE #10.

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Against Fast Riding on Horses and Bicycles.

Section #1. Any person driving, riding or racing horses or other animals to a gait faster than a slow trot, or any person running, riding, or racing upon any bicycle or other machine used for travel or locomotion, at a rate exceeding the gait of a horse on a slow trot, or any person riding a bicycle on the sidewalk, or shall ride without having one hand on the handle-bar, or shall coast or shall ride without a bell upon the bicycle, and failing to give proper warning to persons upon the streets with said bell, shall be deemed guilty of an offense, and on conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00) and costs, or undergo an imprisonment not exceeding five (5) days.

ARTICLE #11.

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Against Discharging Firearms within the Borough and Raising False Alarms.

Section #1. Any person who shall willfully discharge any gun or fire-arm, except in necessary defense of person or property, within the limits of the borough, or who shall wantonly throw any metal, stone, brick, bullet or other missile, or who shall explode any torpedo, bomb, or raise any false alarm of fire or other calamity, shall for every such offense forfeit and pay a fine of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than ten dollars (\$10.00) in addition to any damage occurring from such violation of the ordinance, or undergo an imprisonment not exceeding five (5) days.

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ARTICLE #12.

An ordinance Relating to Shows, Entertainments and Amusements of Whatever Name or Nature.

Section #1. That no person or company of persons, shall exhibit within the limits of the borough, any theatrical or dramatic entertainment, or shall act, exhibit or perform any opera, circus, riding or horsemanship, menagerie, or exhibition of animals, panorama, painting or sculpture, curiosity, tricks of legerdemain, concert, public dance or ball, or any other

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nature, without a license for that purpose, first had and obtained from the Burgess and Treasurer, which said license shall express for what it is granted, and the time it is to continue; the amount of said license shall not be less than(\$3.00) three dollars nor more than ten dollars (\$10.00) for each and every day, or part, that the same may be exhibited, the amount of the license to be determined by the annexed schedule. Provided, that for lectures or scientific or literary subjects, exhibition of fairs, or paintings or statuary, musical parties or concerts for benevolent or charitable purposes, no license or permit shall be required.

Section #2. No person shall act, exhibit, show or perform, or cause to be performed, acted, shown or exhibited, any indecent or blasphemous play, farce, opera, public exhibition, show or entertainment.

Section #3. Any person violating any provision, law or ordinance contained in either the first or second section of the ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or undergo an imprisonment of not more than thirty (30) days in jail or five (5) days in Lock-up.

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### A R T I C L E #13.

Requiring Peddlers, Hawkers, Traveling Merchants, Solicitors or Agents Selling Goods from House to House on the Streets or at a Stand on the Streets or from Wagons to Private Consumers to procure a License.

Section #1. Be it ordained etc., that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or company, to sell or offer to sell within said borough as peddlers, hawkers, traveling merchant, solicitor or agent, either by sample or otherwise any nostrum, patent medicine, pictures, books or any groceries, goods, wares and merchandise of whatever kind to private consumers by peddling or hawking from house to house or on the streets or alleys, or to sell or offer to sell by soliciting orders from house to house, or to deliver orders so solicited, or to sell or offer to sell at stands on the streets or from wagons without first obtaining a license so to do from the Clerk or Burgess of the borough aforesaid.

Section #2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof before the Burgess or other proper

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to be collected as fines, as fines and penalties are by law collected, or undergo an imprisonment of not more than five (5) days in the Lock-up or thirty (30) days in jail.

The fee for granting license under the ordinance shall be. For selling from house to house by sample or otherwise two dollars (\$2.00) per day, for selling on streets or from wagons or stands on the street two dollars (\$2.00) per day for each wagon or stand.

## ARTICLE #14.

### Animals Running at Large.

Section #1. Any person who shall wilfully suffer his horse, cow, calf, mare, gelding, mule, hog, goat or geese to run at large in the borough, shall for each offense forfeit and pay for each of said animals so running at large the sum of two dollars (\$2.00) and any of the before mentioned animals so found running at large shall be considered as a public and common nuisance, and it shall be the duty of the High Constable, Street Commissioner or Policemen to seize and take into custody and impound every one of the said animals so found running at large, and if after four days notice by ten (10) hand bills posted in public places no person shall come forward or claim such animal, and pay said fine and keeping the same, every such animal shall be sold at public sale by the High Constable or Street Commissioner, and after retaining the amount of reasonable costs and expenses he shall pay the balance if any, to the Treasurer of the borough. In this case the informer shall get one-half of the fine of penalty.

## ARTICLE #15.

### Ordinance Relating to Shade and Ornamental Trees.

Section #1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Ford City, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

That any person who shall stand or tie his or her horse, mare, gelding, mule or jack to any shade or ornamental trees on any public street, alley, lane or highway within the borough, shall forfeit and pay a fine of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than ten dollars (\$10.00) for each and every such offense, and in default of payment shall undergo an imprisonment of not more than four (4) days in Lock-up.

Section #2. Any person who shall cut down, kill, break, or in any way or manner injure any shade or ornamental tree or fence or fences or trees, or tree box or flowers or shrubs on any street, alley, lane, park or public

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offense a fine of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than ten dollars (\$10.00) and in default of payment shall undergo an imprisonment of not more than five (5) days in lock-up.

## A R T I C L E # 16.

To Prohibit the Erection of Wooden Awnings and Signs over the Pavement.

Section #1. That after the passage of this ordinance, no person shall erect, or cause to be erected or maintained over, across or above any sidewalk within the said borough, any wooden awning, sign, advertisement or notice, and all such wooden awnings, signs, advertisements or notices swung or fastened over, across or above any sidewalk within the said borough are hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Section #2. The Town Council may require the abatement or removal of such wooden awnings, signs, advertisements or notices by the owner or owners thereof within ten (10) days after the service of a written or printed notice to so abate or remove the same, and any owner or occupant refusing or neglecting to comply with the requirements of such notice, shall forfeit and pay a fine to the Treasurer of the said borough of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than five dollars (\$5.00) for every <sup>period</sup> of twenty-four (24) hours such wooden awnings, or other thing so declared to be a nuisance shall be permitted to remain after the expiration of the said period of ten (10) days aforesaid, and in default of payment of said fine shall undergo an imprisonment of not more than five (5) days in lock-up or thirty (30) days in jail.

## A R T I C L E #17.

Interfering with an Officer.

Section #1. If any person assaults, or in any way hinders or interferes with a policeman while in the discharge of his duty, or if any person or persons called upon by a policeman to assist him in the discharge of his official duties, shall decline or refuse to render assistance, then in either case upon conviction thereof before the Burgess or Justice of the Peace, such person shall be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and costs, and in default of payment be committed to imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days.

## A R T I C L E #18.

To Prevent Riding or Driving on sidewalks and across curbstones.

Section #1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to ride or drive any horse or horses or mules across curbstones or upon sidewalks, and such persons so offending shall be

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and in default of the same shall be sent to the lock-up for a space of not more than five (5) days or thirty (30) days to jail.

ARTICLE #19.

The Keeping of Gunpowder and Other Explosives within the Borough.

Section #1. No person or persons shall keep in any house, shop, store-room, cellar, warehouse, or other building or apartments within the borough, more than one hundred pounds weight of gunpowder at one time, and any number of pounds weight over ten and under one hundred pounds kept by any person or persons on hand for sale or otherwise within the borough, shall be deposited by itself, separate from other goods and commodities, and shall be safely secured in some receptacle, encased with iron, and having painted thereon in large letters the word "gunpowder" and such receptacle shall be kept near some place of exit where the same can be, in case of fire, easily and speedily removed.

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Section #2. No person or persons shall keep on hand for sale or otherwise, or have stored in any place within the borough, gun-cotton, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, or any highly explosive compounds of like nature.

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Any person or persons not conforming to, or violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall forfeit and pay to the use of the borough a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00), and in default of payment of same shall undergo an imprisonment of not more than five (5) days in the lock-up or thirty (30) days in jail.

ARTICLE #20.

Wagons not to Stand on Streets.

Section #1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons using or owning any wagon, cart, dray, buggy, sleigh, or other vehicle, to leave or permit the same to remain when not in use upon any sidewalk, alley, street, or lane of said borough. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction of such violation before the Burgess or a Justice of the Peace, pay a fine of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) or more than five dollars (\$5.00), and in default of payment of said fine shall undergo an imprisonment of not more than five (5) days in lock-up, or thirty (30) days in jail.

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ARTICLE #21.

Bonfires.

Section #1. Any person or persons lighting bonfires or burning rubbish

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fine of not less than three (3) or more than ten dollars (\$10.00), and in default of payment shall undergo an imprisonment of not more than thirty (30) days.

ARTICLE #22.

30 Sidewalk to be Covered during Erection of Buildings.

Section #1. All contractors or owners of property erecting stone or brick buildings on or near the street lines, shall construct sheds or other proper coverings over the sidewalks or foot-pavement to protect all persons passing along the same from accident or injury. <sup>See 11</sup> Any such contractors or owners violating the provisions of this ordinance shall on conviction thereof before the Burgess pay a fine of not less than five (5) or more than ten dollars (\$10.00), and in default of payment shall undergo an imprisonment of not more than five (5) days in lock-up, or more than thirty (30) days in jail.

ARTICLE #23.

Permits for Building Purposes.

8 Section #1. Any person wishing to erect, repair or remove any building, excavate or wall a cellar or vault, or make any improvements which will in any way obstruct any sidewalks, street or alley shall obtain a written permit from the Chief Burgess or Treasurer, which shall describe the locality of such contemplated improvements and specify the time required to do the same.

Section #2. No permit shall be granted for a longer term than six (6) months, and the person or persons receiving such permit shall not block up or obstruct any street or sidewalk or part thereof, except that immediately opposite and in front of the part to be improved. The material to be used shall be put up in regular compact form. Lumber and stone shall be piled parallel with the street or alley, leaving the obstruction shall in no case extend to more than one-half the width of the street, sidewalks, or alleys except when buildings are to be removed bodily across or along streets or from one lot to another, in which case special permits may be granted authorizing the same.

Section #3. For the right to obstruct or encumber the streets, sidewalks or alleys, as heretofore specified, for one month a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) shall be paid the borough Treasurer, and for all additional time at the same rate thereafter, and all material and rubbish shall be removed by the party obtaining the permit before the expiration of same. For the privilege of removing a building as a whole along or across a street a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) per day or fraction thereof shall be

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shall be subject to a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) in addition to any damages, costs, or expense incurred by the borough by reason thereof

Section #4. It shall not be lawful for anyone to dig up or in any way disturb any street, alley, or sidewalk, without first obtaining a permit from the Chief Burgess or Treasurer which permit shall cost one dollar (\$1.00) and shall designate the locality of such contemplated work and the Chief Burgess shall see that all persons to whom permits are so granted shall replace the same in as good condition as before taken up. Any person violating this section is subject to a fine of not less than (\$10.00) and remain liable for all expenses of restoring streets, alleys, and sidewalks to as good condition as they were in before.

Section #5. The Chief Burgess or Treasurer have power and is hereby authorized to grant licenses and permits in accordance with the ordinance of the borough, to such persons as may apply and pay for the same they shall keep account of such grants, with the revenue derived from each.

## A R T I C L E #24.

An Ordinance Fixing The Amount of License To Be Paid By Transient and Retail Merchants in Ford City.

Section #1. Be it ordained, etc. that it shall be unlawful for any person to begin a transient retail business in the borough of Ford City for the sale of any goods, wares or merchandise, whatsoever, whether the same shall be represented or held forth to be bankrupt assignee's or about to quit business or of goods damaged by fire, water, or otherwise, or by any attractive or conspicuous advertisement whatsoever without first having obtained a license from the burgess or clerk so to do.

Section #2. That the amount to be paid for such license shall be fixed at the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per month as provided by Act of Assembly approved fourth day of May A.D. 1889.

Section #3. Any person failing to take out a license or refusing to pay the license tax required by said act, or who violates any of the provisions hereof shall on conviction be fined not less than one hundred dollars, and in default of payment thereof with costs to be imprisoned in the county jail not exceeding thirty days.

## A R T I C L E #25.

Requiring Persons Selling Goods at Public Auction To Procure a License.

Section #1. Be it ordained, etc. that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons company or firm to sell or offer to sell at public auction within the borough aforesaid any nostrums, patent medicines pictures produce or any groceries goods, wares or merchandise of whatsoever kind without

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Section #2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before a Justice of the Peace or other proper authority pay a fine for the use of said borough of not less than (\$5.00) nor more than (\$25.00) for each offense with costs to be collected as fines and penalties are by law collected and on failure to pay said fine shall be sentenced to the lock-up for not more than five days or to the jail for not more than thirty days. The fee for granting licenses under this ordinance shall be: For selling at Public Auction per day (\$8.00) per week.

ARTICLE #26.

Relating to Dogs, The License of, and Dog Pounds thereof.

Section #1. Be it ordained and enacted by the borough of Ford City, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, that no person shall have, keep, maintain or harbor any dog or bitch within the limits of Ford City without first having obtained a license from the Clerk of the said borough as hereinafter provided.

Section #2. That the Borough Clerk shall from time to time grant license to such persons as shall apply for the same to have, keep, possess, maintain and harbor dogs and bitches within the borough of Ford City which license shall continue for one year and no longer and each person to whom such license shall be given shall pay therefor to the said Borough Clerk the sum of (50) cents for each male dog and (\$1.00) for each bitch. Said license to contain the name, breed, sex, age, and other points of identification of the animal for which such license is issued. Every such animal so licensed shall have and continuously wear around its neck a collar with a metal tag and plate having thereon the number of license granted for said animal attached thereto, which said metal tag or plate shall be furnished to the applicant for said license by said Borough Clerk.

Section #3. The said Borough Clerk shall keep a full and complete record of every license issued by him showing the name and residence of the person to whom said license is issued, the description and kind together with all marks of identification of the animal for which said license is issued and the number of said license as hereafter set forth.

Section #4. Any person who, after the passage of this ordinance, has, keeps, maintains or harbors any unlicensed dog or bitch within the corporate limits of the borough of Ford City shall forfeit or pay the sum of five dollars for each and every offense to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace of said borough as debts of like amount are now by

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animal shall be named the owner thereof and liable for the penalty. Any and all of such animals found going abroad, loose or at large without having around its neck the said collar having attached thereto the said metal tag, or plate aforesaid shall be prima facie deemed unlicensed.

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Section #5. That the Council of said borough shall appoint a poundmaster to serve during the pleasure of Council and at such compensation as shall be agreed upon, whose duty it shall be to impound and imprison in such place or pound as may be provided by Council all dogs and bitches that may at any time be found running at large, loose or going abroad in any of the public streets, lanes, alley, highways or other public places within the corporate limits of the borough of Ford City without being licensed and wearing the metal tag or plate hereinbefore set forth.

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Section #6. No animal impounded or imprisoned as aforesaid shall be released and discharged from said pound except by the owner thereof making demand thereafter at the pound in which such animal may be imprisoned or impounded within forty-eight hours after such animal was impounded or imprisoned therein, proving ownership to the satisfaction of the poundmaster, paying him fifty cents for each and every day or fraction thereof during which such animal was imprisoned or impounded and procuring a license for said animal in the manner provided in this ordinance.

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Section #7. That said poundmaster shall cause all of said animals remaining in such pound for forty-eight hours after being imprisoned or impounded therein without being claimed or released as hereinbefore provided, to be put to death in such a manner and by such means and methods as he may direct.

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Section #8. Any person except the owner who shall remove from the neck of any dog or bitch the metal tag or plate hereinbefore specified, shall upon conviction thereof before Justice of the Peace be fined not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars and in default of payment be committed to the county jail for a period of thirty days which punishment shall be in addition to the fine and penalty provided by law for the punishment of larceny.

## ARTICLE #27.

Relating to Fines, Fees and Costs.

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Section #1. That all fines and forfeitures under the provisions of the ordinance of the borough shall be recovered by a summary conviction before the Burgess and in all cases of conviction, the party convicted shall be liable to pay in addition to the fine or forfeiture the legal fees and costs

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Section #2. In case any person or persons sentenced by the Burgess under the provisions of any ordinance of the borough shall neglect or refuse to pay the same, together with the fees and costs thereon, such person may be committed to the lockup house for a period not exceeding five days or to jail not more than thirty days, the time prescribed by law and the fine together with the fees and costs may be collected by proceedings before the Justice of the Peace.

Section #3. Fees and costs of the Burgess, High Constable and Police-men shall be the same as those prescribed by law for Justice of the Peace and Constable of the Commonwealth for like services. Provided that the borough shall in no case be liable for the cost and fees of such officers.
