

FORD CITY BOROUGH ORDINANCE NO. 2

ARTICLE #28.

That Article #13 of the Borough Ordinance passed December 16th 1898, requiring hawkers, peddlers, traveling merchants, solicitors or agents selling goods from house to house, on the Streets or at a stand on the Streets or from wagons to private consumers to procure a license is hereby repealed.

ARTICLE #29.

Requiring Peddlers, Hawkers, Traveling Merchants, Solicitors or Agents selling goods from house to house, on the streets or at a stand on the streets or from wagons to private consumers to procure a license.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Borough of Ford City and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same.

Section #1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or company to sell or offer to sell within said borough as peddlers, hawkers, traveling merchants, solicitors or agents either by sample or otherwise any nostrum, patent medicine, pictures, books or any groceries, goods, wares and merchandise or whatever kind to private consumers by peddling or hawking from house to house or on the streets or alleys, or to sell or offer to sell by soliciting orders from house to house or to deliver orders so solicited, or to sell or offer to sell at stands on the streets or from wagons without first obtaining a license so to do from the Clerk or Burgess of the borough aforesaid.

Section #2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before the Burgess or other proper authority, pay a fine for the use of said borough of not less than (\$3.00) nor more than (\$25.00) for each offense to be collected as fines and penalties are by law collected, or undergo an imprisonment of not more than five (5) days in the lock-up or thirty (30) days in jail.

Section #3. The fee for granting license under this ordinance shall be: For selling from house to house by sample or otherwise (50) cents per day, or from selling from stand on street (\$2.00) per day, for selling from a wagon on the street with single horse attached (50) cents per day or (\$12.50) per year, for selling from a wagon on the street with two horses attached (50) cents per day or (\$25.00) per year, for selling from two wagons on the street belonging to the same person or firm one dollar per day or (\$40.00) per year.

ARTICLE #30.

without first having obtained a license to engage in such work and no person shall be allowed to transport through any of the public streets, avenues or alleys any of the material removed from any privy vault, cesspool or reservoir unless the same is transported in an air tight apparatus, or in such manner the none of the contents shall escape from or be exposed to the open air during transportation, except by the consent of the Town Council, and further the applicant has an unobjectionable place and method of disposing of the material removed from the privy, cesspool or reservoir and the same shall only be removed between the hours of 10 P.M. and 3 A. M.

Section #2. The license for granting the privilege mentioned in Section #1 shall be eight dollars per year.

Section #3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof pay a fine of not less than (\$5.00) or more than (\$20.00) for each offense, and in default of payment shall undergo imprisonment in the lock-up not exceeding 36 hours or ten days in jail.

ARTICLE #31.

Relating to Telephone Companies and the Taxing of Poles and Wire.

Section #1. That the poles of every telephone company shall be inspected by the police department of said borough at least once a year, that the same may be kept in safe and proper condition.

Section #2. That each pole maintained or erected within the limits of the said borough shall be liable to an annual license tax of fifty cents per pole and each mile of each strand of suspended wire shall be liable to an annual tax of twenty-five cents per mile.

Section #3. That same tax shall be paid to the Treasurer of said borough on or before the 1st day of March of each year, who shall issue his receipt thereof, showing the number of poles and miles of wire for which the license tax is paid.

Section #4. If any person or persons, company or corporation shall fail to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, he, they or it shall be liable to a penalty of not less than (\$50.00) nor more than (\$100.00) to be collected by suit in the name of the borough before the Chief Burgess or any Justice of the Peace for the use of said borough.

ARTICLE #32.

Relating to Hacks, Omnibuses, Carriages, Wagons, Sleigh and other Vehicles and requiring the same to be Licensed and Taxed.

Section #1. That all drays or wagons used upon the streets and alleys of the said borough in carrying persons or property of any kind for pay
