

FORD CITY BOROUGH ORDINANCE NO. 239

AN ORDINANCE

Of the Borough of Ford City, Pennsylvania, revoking, annulling and cancelling a certain ordinance of said borough, approved April 4, 1927 (Ordinance No. 163), whereby a certain strip of land, hereinafter particularly described, was taken, declared and opened as a street and highway for public purposes,, the same being commonly known as Thirteenth Street Extension.

The Town Council of the Borough of Ford City, Pennsylvania, ordains as follows:-

Sec. 1- That a certain ordinance of said Borough of Ford City, Pa., approved April 4, 1927 (Ordinance No. 163, under and by which virtue of which a certain strip of land in said borough was taken declared and opened as a street and highway for public purposes, be and the same is hereby revoked, annulled and cancelled; and all rights of the said Borough of Ford City and of the traveling public in, along or over the same are hereby abandoned.

Sec. 2- Said strip of land herein referred to, and commonly known as Thirteenth Street Extension, is more particularly described as follows:- A certain strip or parcel of land, of the uniform width of forty-eight (48) feet, four (4) inches through and over the lands and property of the Eljer Company, the center line of which said street or, public highway being designated as follows:-

Beginning at a point on the western line of the right of way of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, in the Borough of Ford City and at a point approximately two hundred thirty-nine (239) feet north from the center line of Thirteenth Street extended, which point is twenty-four (24) feet two (2) inches south from the property line of the Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company; thence in a westerly direction, at a distance of twenty-four (24) feet two (2) inches from the property line of the Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company, for a distance of three hundred fourteen (314) feet two (2) inches to a point; thence in a southerly direction, a distance of approximately one hundred thirty-nine (139) feet to a point ninety-nine (99) feet two (2) inches from the center line of Thirteenth Street; thence in a westerly direction, at a distance of twenty-four (24) feet two (2) inches from the northern line of property and lands of the said Borough of Ford City, to the low water mark of the Allegheny River.

Ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Ford City, Pa., lawfully assembled, this sixteenth day of December, 1947.
