

AN ORDINANCE INCREASING THE FEES FOR
ENFORCEMENT OF ORDINANCE NO. 469 AND 560, GOVERNING
THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, ENLARGEMENT,
EQUIPMENT, REPAIR, DEMOLITION, REMOVAL,
CONVERSION, USE, OCCUPANCY AND MAINTENANCE
OF ALL BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FORD CITY HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS
BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE SAME:

SECTION 1.

Section 2 of Ordinance No. 469 and 2.02 of 560 are hereby amended
in part, and amended to read as follows:

Fees for permits for building, construction, alteration,
converting or enlarging any building or structure shall be as
follows:

Where the estimated cost does not exceed \$500.00, the fee
shall be \$10.00.

Where the estimated cost is more than \$500.00, but does not
exceed \$1,000.00, the fee shall be \$20.00.

Where the estimated cost exceeds \$1,000.00, the fee shall be
\$20.00, plus \$4.00 for each additional \$1,000.00 in excess of the
first \$1,000.00.

SECTION 2.

Section 2 of Ordinance No. 469 is hereby amended in part to read
as follows:

Fees for Permits for demolition of a building or structure
shall be as follows:

Where the estimated cost does not exceed \$500.00, the fee
shall be \$15.00.

Where the estimated cost is more than \$500.00, but does not
exceed \$1,000.00, the fee shall be \$25.00.

Where the estimated cost exceeds \$1,000.00, the fee shall be \$25.00 for the first \$1,000.00, plus \$5.00 for each additional \$1,000.00.

SECTION 3. Unless specifically amended herein, all provisions of Ordinance No. 469, as previously enacted, shall remain the same.

SECTION 4: Ordinances or parts thereof, enforced at the time this Ordinance, shall take effect and in consistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall be effective immediately.
