

ORDINANCE NO. 620

SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE  
FORD CITY BOROUGH POLICE PENSION PLAN  
(as amended and restated, effective January 1, 1989)

THIS AMENDMENT, made this 21st day of June, 1994, effective January 1, 1993, by Ford City Borough, located in Armstrong County, Pennsylvania, (hereinafter called the "Employer").

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, the Ford City Borough Police Pension Plan Ordinance No. 378, (hereinafter called the "Plan") was totally amended and restated, effective January 1, 1989; and

WHEREAS, the Employer now desires the Plan to be amended;

NOW THEREFORE, the Plan is hereby amended as follows:

1. Ordinance No. 378, at Article VI, section 6.01, is amended to read as follow:

6.01. Disability Retirement Benefits - For any participant who retires due to a "Total and Permanent Disability", such participant shall be deemed to have retired as of his Disability Retirement Date. The disability retirement benefit shall be a monthly amount equal to fifty (50%) percent of the participant's monthly base pay and longevity increments determined as of the date when his employment terminates due to Total and Permanent Disability.

2. Ordinance No. 378, at Article IV, shall be amended by adding

a new section 4.06, which shall read as follows:

4.06. Prior Military Service - Employees who were not employed by the Employer prior to military service, may buy pension credit for each year of active duty of military service or fraction thereof, not to exceed five (5) years, as provided for in Act 600 of 1956, as amended. It is expressly understood that the said officer is solely responsible for paying the purchase price of the pension credit. The purchase price is to be determined as provided for by act 600 of 1956, more specifically, 53 P.S. 770(b) Military Service, as amended.
